

Collections Project

Due: Thursday, January 26

Is there something that you collect OR something that you would like to collect? What things are you interested in? Our current math unit has sparked a discussion in our class about collections. Some of us collect baseball cards, snow globes, rocks, pencils, music boxes, etc.

Follow the guidelines below to create a collection display for your class to see.

Write two paragraphs about your collection. The first paragraph should tell how or why you started your collection, what you enjoy about your collection, and why you feel others might benefit from viewing your collection.

The second paragraph should describe what is in your collection. What are the contents? (Don't describe each and every item. Instead, categorize your collection pieces and describe the general groups).

We will provide the tag board for your child. Neatly decorate the center section and create a title that is centered and noticeable from a distance. Write legibly or type your work. Place them onto a piece of background paper and paste them to the side sections. You may put some of your collection pieces in front of the display. If the items are breakable or valuable, pictures attached to the display board will work just as well. Bring your display to school on the due date above. We will talk about the assignment during school but the work will be

completed at home. The students have seen photograph examples of the project.

Your child's desk will be their display table. It measures 18 inches by 23 inches. We can also supply colored construction paper for your child to use to make their display. Just ask!

This assignment is for all second graders. We will tour all grade two rooms and be able to see over 110 collection displays!

Do your best work! Who knows...maybe you will inspire somebody to start a new collection. We can't wait to see them!
